1	The I	Petitioner, Donna Miller, would show this Court as follows:
2	1.	Petitioner is the personal representative of the Estate of Eric Miller.
3	2.	The Estate of Eric Miller is presently open in the probate court of Wake County, North
4		Carolina.
5	3.	Petitioner, by and through her attorney, commenced the present action against Monsanto
6 7		Company on October 1, 2019, in the United States District Court for the District of South
8		Carolina.
9	4.	On November 7, 2019, this action was transferred to the Northern District of California
10		via order of the Judicial Panel on Multidistrict Litigation.
11	5.	The Court's order of July 23, 2021 (PTO 240) required Petitioner to participate in the
12 13		Independent Roundup Settlement Program administered by Kenneth Feinberg.
14	6.	The Petitioner informed Administrator Feinberg that she accepts the offer of settlement
15		produced by the settlement program.
16	7.	This petitioner seeks court approval of the acceptance of the settlement offer.
17		CONTROLLING LAW
18	8.	Eric Miller resided in North Carolina at the time of his death; however, Miller previously
19		resided in South Carolina, was exposed to Roundup in South Carolina, and contracted
20		Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma in South Carolina.
21	0	
22	9.	As a result, the substantive law of the State of South Carolina controls Petitioner's right
23		to seek compensation for the wrongful death of Eric Miller and the survival actions
24		possessed by the Estate of Eric Miller. See S.C. Code Ann. § 15-51-10, et seq.
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10. South Carolina law provides "[o]nly a duly appointed personal representative, as defined 1 in Section 62-1-201(30), shall have the authority to settle wrongful death or survival 2 3 actions." S.C. Code Ann. § 15-51-42(A). 4 11. As to the petition of the proposed settlement, South Carolina law further provides: 5 The petition must be verified by the personal representative and shall set forth, in terms satisfactory to the court in which the petition 6 is filed, the basic facts surrounding the death of the decedent, the pertinent facts surrounding the liability of the alleged wrongdoer, 7 the amount of insurance available to pay for damages, the terms of 8 the proposed settlement, the statutory beneficiaries of the wrongful death or survival action, the heirs at law or appropriate devisees of 9 the estate, the appropriate creditors, the amount of their claims, and, if the personal representative has retained legal counsel, the terms 10 and provisions of the agreement with respect to attorney's fees and costs. 11 12 S.C. Code Ann. § 15-51-42(B). 13 **ANALYSIS OF PROPOSED SETTLEMENT** 14 A. **Basic Facts Surrounding Death of Decedent** 15 12. Decedent Eric Miller was born in the State of New York on January 22, 1958. 16 13. Decedent Eric Miller was first diagnosed with large B-cell lymphoma on August 15, 2019. 17 He underwent extensive treatment including 6 cycles of CHOP, recurrence treatment from 18 2019 – 2020, subsequently in 2020 decedent underwent several rounds of MATRix 19 20 treatment for metastasized lymphoma in early 2020, with additional chemotherapy 21 targeting metastatic cancer in his central nervous system and testicles. 22 14. Decedent Eric Miller died of Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma ("NHL"), specifically diffuse 23 large B-cell lymphoma on August 28, 2023. 24 15. On January 10, 2024, Donna Miller was appointed as the Personal Representative of the 25 Estate of Eric Miller. (**Exhibit A**— Letters Testamentary) 26 27 B. **Pertinent Facts Surrounding Liability of Monsanto Company**

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- 16. At all times relevant to the Complaint, Monsanto Company manufactured, marketed, and 1 sold Roundup herbicide products. 2 3 17. Decedent Eric Miller used and was otherwise exposed to Roundup products from 4 approximately the 1970s until the 2010s. 5 18. Petitioner contends that the decedents use of and exposure to Roundup caused the 6 decedent's NHL and ultimate death. 7 19. Monsanto Company denies that exposure to Roundup causes NHL and also denies that 8 the decedent's use of and exposure to Roundup specifically caused the decedent's NHL 9 and death. 10 11 C. **Amount of Insurance Available** 12 20. The atypical nature of the funding of the Independent Roundup Settlement Program 13 renders this consideration inapplicable. 14 D. **Terms of Proposed Settlement** 15 21. If the proposed settlement is approved, the Petitioner would dismiss all claims set forth 16 against Monsanto Company and release all other potential claims against Monsanto 17 18 Company stemming from the NHL and/or death suffered by the Decedent in exchange 19 for payment of 20 22. Petitioner further proposes that 5% of the gross settlement proceeds be 21 allocated as consideration for the release of the wrongful death claims of the statutory 22 beneficiaries while 95% of the gross settlement proceeds be allocated as 23 consideration for the relief of the survival claims belonging to the Estate. 24 23. Monsanto takes no position as to the propriety of the settlement proceeds and has not 25 26 participated in the proposed division.

- 30. South Carolina law further provides that any wrongful death settlement proceeds "shall be divided among the before-mentioned parties in those shares as they would have been entitled to if the deceased had died intestate and the amount recovered had been personal assets of his or her estate." S.C. Code Ann. § 15-51-40.
- 31. South Carolina laws of intestacy provide that the share of the surviving spouse is "if there are surviving issue, one-half of the intestate estate." S.C. Code Ann. § 62-2-102(2).
- 32. South Carolina laws of intestacy further provide that the shares of the surviving children are "if they are all of the same degree of kinship to the decedent they take equally." S.C. Code Ann. § 62-2-103.
- 33. As a result, if the proposed settlement is approved the statutory beneficiaries will take from the settlement as follows:

Donna Miller

Justin Miller

Maureen Miller

Ashley Miller

Alyssa Miller

(50.00% of Net Settlement Proceeds)

(12.50% of Net Settlement Proceeds)

34. All statutory beneficiaries are above twenty-one years of age.

F. Heirs at Law or Appropriate Devisees of the Estate

35. Eric Miller possessed a Last Will and Testament at the time of his death. This will be being administered by the Probate Court of Wake County, North Carolina. Pursuant to the terms of the will, all settlement assets of the estate will be distributed to Donna Miller.

G. Appropriate Creditors and Amount of Claims

36. No creditors have claimed entitlement to any proceeds of this settlement beyond the lien claimed by the Center for Medicare/Medicaid Services listed in paragraph 23.

H. Terms of Representation by Counsel

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1	37. Graham L. Newman, Esq. of Chappell, Chappell & Newman, Attorneys serves as the	
2	attorney for the Petitioner and the Estate of Eric Miller. Chappell, Chappell & Newman,	
3	Attorneys has agreed to represent the Petitioner and the Estate for forty percent of the	
4	settlement proceeds and reimbursement of litigation costs incurred less the common	
5	benefit hold-back (8%) ordered by the Court.





- 5. Petitioner has presented to the court all information pertinent to the proposed settlement required by S.C. Code Ann. § 15-51-42(B).
